IMPACT HIGHLIGHTS

8,000+

Residents received more than 7,500 types of health/basic needs, educational and workforce development programs and services.

4,053

Low-income immigrants participated in English as Second Language training and/or GED courses to enhance their job readiness.

610

Homeless men, women and children received three nutritious, daily meals.

323

Low-income households received rental assistance and utility assistance to avert eviction or utility shut off.

62

Youth between the ages of 7 to 17 were supported in mentoring relationships.

INITIATIVES

MIDDLE GRADE SUCCESS

\$260,000

Was invested to support 458 students at Buck Lodge, William Wirt and Drew Freeman middle schools. Students received tutoring, nutrition classes, physical fitness activities and basic needs services.

FINANCIAL EMPOWERMENT CENTER

\$150,000

Was invested to create a Financial Empowerment Center at Prince George's Community College. 319 low-to-moderate income residents, community college students and student veterans received tax preparation assistance, 1-on-1 financial coaching and/or attended financial workshops.

FUN, FLY AND FIT

\$330,000

Was invested in United Way NCA's signature anti-childhood obesity program, Fun, Fly & Fit (FFF) at 16 elementary schools in the County. Nearly 1,200 students received nutrition education and engaged in physical activity to encourage healthy lifestyles.

HOMETOWN HUDDLE - KABOOM PLAYGROUND BUILD

\$50,000

Invested in partnership with the Washington Redskins Charitable Foundation, Kaboom, Bender Foundation, Inc. Southern Associates, and Prince George's County Social Innovation Fund to build a playground that will benefit 1,800 kids annually.
