

Our fight for 100% high school graduation begins in middle school.

Because students who start ninth grade on schedule, read at grade level, and have grade-appropriate math skills are three times more likely to graduate from high school than students who don't.

More Than a Mentor

At a very early age, Julian was already moving through the world in search of an escape. From difficulty at home to trouble in school – it was nearly impossible for Julian to envision a world of his own. But Julian soon found hope in Rebecca O'Connor.

Before meeting Rebecca, Julian struggled to center his thoughts and feelings. He was a shy kid by nature, but there was a quiet storm brewing inside him. That is until Rebecca helped him channel his imagination through reading.

Watching Julian not only open up to Rebecca, but to bloom a curiosity for learning was the reason O'Connor asserted that everyone should be a mentor.

"It's just been wonderful to see the magic when a child discovers books and discovers a love of reading," she shares. Having grown alongside Julian for six years now, O'Connor couldn't imagine how meaningful their relationship would become to her.

The dynamic duo stood side by side at the Creating Mentoring Moments annual event as Rebecca was awarded the 2019 Mentoring Matters Coalition Mentor of the Year. Through the Mentoring Matters Coalition, United Way NCA aims to enhance the quantity and quality of mentoring relationships for young people in the National Capital Area to ensure children have the supportive relationships they need to grow and develop into thriving, productive and engaged adults.

JOIN THE FIGHT FOR FINANCIAL STABILITY.

In the National Capital Area, as many as 260,000 residents are unbanked—unable to access or use banking services. This leaves them vulnerable to money predators or unreasonable fees for conducting simple transactions like cashing a check, and trapped in a cash and money order world.

United Way NCA is fighting to knock down those financial barriers through our Financial Empowerment Centers that offer access to professional financial services and guidance, provide low income residents with free tax preparation assistance, and financial education programs designed to help individuals and families attain financial stability for themselves and their households.

A Journey from Debt to Hope

Sean's first year out of college, he worked three part-time jobs, freelanced on the side and performed any chance he got to earn an income. He was fulfilling every millennial's dream — except that he lived off of \$15 a week for food and almost completely blew his savings trying to stay on top of loan repayments starting at \$945 per month.

Now that he's found steady employment and his savings are (for the most part) replenished, he wanted to deepen his knowledge of investing. Sean learned that United Way NCA Financial Empowerment Centers offered free financial coaching.

When he arrived at the FEC, Sean was greeted by Xavier — the personal financial coach assigned to him. Sean and Xavier looked at his total net income versus expenses like student loan repayments, rent, food, and transportation. They discussed emergency savings and contributing to his 403b, Money Markets, Mutual Funds, in addition to the stock market.

From ONE session at the Financial Empowerment Center, and coaching from Xavier, Sean has so much more clarity on the options available and a plan for investing, saving and budgeting in the future.

JOIN THE FIGHT FOR HEALTH.

Better health leads to a better life. That's why United Way NCA is fighting for better access to health care as well as education that leads to better care of ourselves. We're making strategic investments in programs that provide adults and children with avenues to health services they need to not only be well, but to thrive as well.

Good health and nutrition are also leading factors in a young person's ability to succeed academically as well as a family's ability to achieve financial stability. We will continue to fight for public policies and programs that bring enhanced health and wellness for our community's residents.

Managing the High-Cost of Prescription Drugs

For the last decade, FamilyWize and United Way NCA have helped over 120,000 people in the nation's capital save upwards of 75% on their prescription medication. As of November 2018, savings for National Capital Area users surmounted \$13 million dollars for local families through the FamilyWize card. As nationwide out of pocket spending on prescription drugs skyrockets nearly 7% between now and 2021, Americans are expected to dish out nearly \$610 billion dollars for their medications. Even with insurance, the monthly costs for medications can teeter families on the edge of financial ruin. Such was the case for Mary Smith before she discovered the FamilyWize Card.

At \$400 a month, Mary struggled with her insurance to cover the cost of her diabetic son's insulin prescription. Having nowhere else to turn, she called her local United Way where she discovered FamilyWize.

Using FamilyWize's pricing tool, Mary was able to locate a pharmacy that offered a discount on insulin for FamilyWize cardholders for only \$88 a month.

"It's such a helpless feeling when someone gets a prescription and they see the high cost and think 'well, what now?'" confides Mike Carollo of FamilyWize.

Through our partnership with FamilyWize, United Way NCA seeks to heighten the awareness of the program to empower those in our community towards greater health. Access to affordable medication should be a right to every household in the National Capital Area and across the country.


