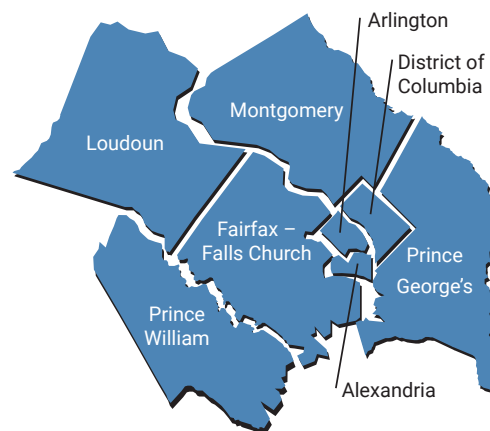


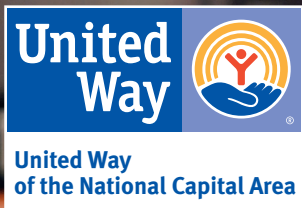
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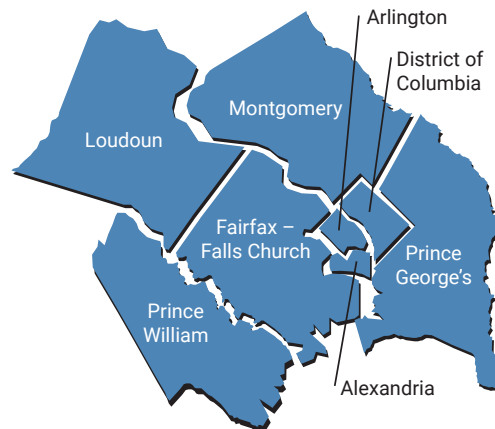




IMPACT REPORT

United Way of the National Capital Area fights for the health, education and financial stability of every person in our community. We serve our neighbors in eight jurisdictions across the region including the District of Columbia, Alexandria, Arlington, Fairfax/Falls Church, Loudoun County and Prince William counties in Virginia; Montgomery County and Prince George's counties in Maryland through our \$12.3 million, 5-year Community Commitment which tackles complex, interconnected issues like high school graduation rates, poverty and poor health. Through focused research and conversations throughout our community, we learned we must focus on these areas that represent the critical needs of the most underserved in our community.

HEALTH

We are committed to improving the overall health of all the children and families served through our Education and Financial Stability work.

Impact: Our Fun, Fly & Fit youth wellness initiative fights childhood obesity and food insecurity through our fitness and nutrition clubs, running clubs, Weekend Backpack Program, After School Snack Program and Community Corner food pantry, which supports more than 7,000 middle school students and families.

EDUCATION

We are committed to preparing 12,000 students to transition to high school performing at grade level and on track to succeed by June 2020.

Impact: We've served more than 8,000 students through our 13 community schools to positively impact attendance, behavior and course performance. Specifically, we provide a comprehensive range of academic, behavioral and social supports through case management, tutoring programs and home visits.

FINANCIAL STABILITY

We are committed to providing 100,000 residents with services that remove barriers to financial stability by June 2020.

Impact: Through our Financial Empowerment Centers, Project Homeless Connect and our free tax preparation partnerships, we have served more than 58,000 residents.
