

#### WHO: ALICE Lives Here

- We serve our region's Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed (ALICE) individuals and their families, working collaboratively toward a brighter future.
- □ ALICE households earn above the Federal Poverty Level, yet they are not eligible for assistance and cannot afford the basic household necessities, including housing, childcare, food, transportation, and health care.
- Nearly 500,000 households (an estimated 1.3 million individuals) in our region are ALICE
- ☐ Over 650,000 households live below the ALICE Threshold of Financial Survival
- ☐ ALICE households are disproportionately **communities of color**.








#### **ALICE** Single Adult


ALICE Survival Household Budget estimates minimal total cost of household essentials.






#### **ALICE** Family of Four

#### Weekend Hunger Backpack Program:

Providing nutritious and easy-to-prepare food to young students, helping them avoid hunger over the weekend when they cannot depend on school cafeteria meals.

#### 2-1-1:

A free, confidential referral and information helpline, 2-1-1 connects callers to essential health and human services 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

#### SingleCare:

SingleCare provides access to affordable prescription medications to help promote financial stability for our region's individuals and families.

#### Thrive United 365:

Thrive United 365 provides equitable access to and distribution of health resources to improve people's lives by addressing health conditions most affecting our communities.

#### Middle School Success

Providing academic, social and health support to middle school students to help them perform at grade level and prepare for the transition to high school.

#### **Character Playbook**

An evidence-based solution for schools, which provides self-guided and interactive lessons to begin conversations on why character education and positive relationships matter in middle school.







#### **Economic Opportunity Programs**

#### **Project Community Connect**

United Way NCA's annual Project Community Connect provides much-needed resources to our region's ALICE (Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed) population and our neighbors at risk of or experiencing homelessness.

#### Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) D.C.

The Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program provides free tax help to low- and moderate-income individuals and families, persons with disabilities and limited-English-speaking taxpayers in Washington, DC and neighboring counties.

#### Financial Empowerment Centers

United Way NCA's powerful network of five Financial Empowerment Centers provide the needed tools for community members to gain greater control over their personal finances to increase their economic opportunity.
